

North Liberty Business Banquet

Stefan began work on the annual production of a video for the North Liberty Business Banquet. This year focuses on young professionals living, working and playing in North Liberty. Every year, the banquet provides an opportunity to invest additional time into a production that we hope has a long shelf life and long-term value.

ICAD Showcase

For the Iowa City Area Development Group's 30th anniversary, Erika and Nick attended with a tongue-in-cheek display for Triple Tree Gum — complete with packs of spearmint gum to give away — as a fun way to talk about the great things North Liberty has to offer: small-town flavor, growing customer base, innovative opportunities. At the annual meeting, North Liberty was also recognized for its 30 years of investing in the ICAD Group.

City Week

The Iowa League of Cities encourages members to highlight the work they do daily during the organization's annual City Week, this year scheduled for Oct. 12 through 16. We're organizing a couple things for the week, with the help of other departments: we'll publish a Q & A with a different city employee each day so residents can get to know the people who make the city go. We've also asked others to take a photo of their day each hour, which we'll publish in throughout the week so residents can "go along" with city employees throughout their day.

Innovation Expo

The City of North Liberty is one sponsor of the EDC's annual Innovation Expo, scheduled for Oct. 21 this year at the Coralville Marriott, and we've been invited to set up a display. We're developing a display focusing on three ways we support innovators: the city- and ICAD-sponsored CoLab for beginning and early stage businesses, small-business development loans for growing businesses and building incentives for larger businesses putting down roots.

Economic Development Guide

We've continued to edit drafts of the economic development guide that we've been working on with the *Corridor Business Journal*. Some additional stories and profiles were added to the

magazine during the month, which should be completed in October. The magazine is expected to be published this fall.

City Council Candidate Videos and Forums

Erika and Stefan recorded video statements from the four candidates for City Council. Once the light post production is complete (trimming the ends and adding lower thirds, mostly), the statements will be published online with other city-election information. The League of Women Voters are hosting a candidate forum at 7 p.m. on Oct. 29 which we will also cover live, playback on the channel and have available for on-demand viewing.

Annual Convention and Visitors Bureau Guide

We collected new photos, updated text and other elements needed for the CVB's annual guide. The guide, covering places and things-to-do in Iowa City, Coralville and North Liberty, will be published later this fall.

KCJJ

Nick was a guest on the inaugural North Liberty-focused KCJJ noon show on Sept. 21 from Mirabito's Italian Restaurant. It's a great opportunity to talk about the exciting things going on in North Liberty on the first and third Mondays of each month. KCJJ reported that they've already booked their first six shows.

North Liberty Business Banquet

Stefan completed "A Town for Us," featuring three young professionals from North Liberty and their reasons for living, working and playing here. The video, the production of which is an annual ritual, will debut at the North Liberty Business Banquet on Nov. 5.

City Week

The Iowa League of Cities encourages its members to highlight the work they do every day during the organization's annual City Week. This year, it was scheduled for Oct. 12 to 16. With the help of other departments, we published a Q & A with a different city employee each day of the week so residents can get to know the people who make the city go. We also had three departments document their days in photos. We shared the photos — one at a time — throughout a day on Twitter and as a gallery on Facebook. We were pretty happy with the plan this year, and will look to replicate it next year.

Innovation Expo

We had a display set up at the EDC's annual Innovation Expo, on Oct. 21, as one of the event's sponsors. Staff also attended portions of the day, including InnovateHER and the Seed & Venture forum.

Economic Development Guide

We've completed edits, layout and the rest for the economic development guide. It has been sent to the printer with delivery expected in November. Additionally, about 4,200 will be inserted into the Dec. 7 edition of the *Corridor Business Journal*, and 2,000 mailed to business leaders in Iowa, Illinois and Wisconsin. We will have 1,300 to distribute locally.

City Council Candidate Videos and Forums

We produced and published recorded video statements from the four candidates for City Council, produced a candidate forum hosted by the League of Women Voters. Election and candidate information was available on the city's website as it became available.

Nick continues to work on a mid-winter event with a small group of residents. Tentatively scheduled for Jan. 30, 2016, at Penn Meadows Park. The goal is to encourage residents to embrace winter and the outdoors with games for a variety of ages and skills.

Safety committee

Stefan joined the city's safety committee and began working with representatives from the Community Center on building-specific plans and signs, as well as tracking training and other safety issues within the city and department.

Community Center activity brochure

We have been working with the recreation department and the library on the thrice-yearly activity brochure. Its publication is scheduled for late November, with registration beginning in early December for programming January through April.

Cablecast equipment

Erika has begun working on the first stage of equipment replacement. We're working on equipment that should be able to move to fiber transport when that becomes available to us with Mediacom (we already convey our signal to South Slope over fiber), even though likely won't happen until we're housed in the proposed new civic campus. Some recent equipment failures have led to temporary fixes while we assemble a permanent solution.

Blues & BBQ

The event that never stops. Early planning and fund raising for the tenth (!) year has begun. We're hoping to host a very special headliner for the event, which will require additional fundraising.

Snow Emergency Notification

We had the first declared snow emergency of the season on Nov. 20. Notification was provided to the public by via e-mail, local TV news, Facebook, Twitter, website and press release. We're now in our fifth season of the ordinance. Implementation seemed to be smooth this year.

FaceNick

We dusted off FaceNick for the first time in about two years. He talked about snow. Of course. We'd like to produce at least one new segment a month offering explanations and information about North Liberty's inner workings.

Library Annual Report

Stefan worked with the North Liberty Community Library to translate its annual report into an animated, fun and easy-to-digest video report. The video was shared with the Library Board of Trustees at its meeting and is available online.

Fire Department Educational Videos

Stefan worked with the North Liberty Fire Department to produce two new promotional videos centered on fire safety and smoke detectors. "Change Your Clock, Change Your Batteries," is a reminder to replace batteries in smoke detectors at the switch away from daylight saving time. "Hear the Beep Where You Sleep" focused on fire prevention work of the department.
