Re: Monthly Report

We performed various building maintenance tasks as needed this month.

We picked up trash and pet waste stations as needed this month.

We maintained ball fields, soccer fields and facilities at Penn Meadows Park this month. The season has recently come to a close so we have winterizing all facilities including the splash pad.

All turf grass irrigation areas have been winterized for the season.

We performed equipment repair and preventative maintenance on equipment as needed this month. We have begun servicing winter equipment as time permits.

We have been mowing and trimming all City parks and grounds. We continue to perform ground, landscape and pond maintenance. We have finished winterizing all City landscaping areas.

The City owned land west of the City maintenance facility has been cleared of all trees to make room for future storage. For example: Trees & brush, mulch, black dirt, concrete debris, spare water pipe, ads pipe and things that clutter up our main campus site but are still important to store or stage for future jobs. There will be a future gate and fence around the area to prevent access to the public. The Water, Streets and Parks Departments are collaborating together on this project.

The Parks Department removed all of the trees, brush and undergrowth from the south side berm along the pond at Freedom Park. We will grade and plant turf grass seed when the conditions are adequate.

The Parks Department removed all of the outfield fencing, warning track and batting cage at the Babe Ruth Baseball field in preparation of the new fence and batting cage. D&N Fence installed the new fence and batting cage shortly after. This has been a joint effort between the City and the ICCSD in preparation of Liberty High JV and Varsity baseball teams using the field next season.

Parks Staff attended the Aquatic, Forest, and Roadside Pest Management Re-Certification Applicator Class on October 18th at the Johnson County Extension Office. This is required annually to maintain our state pesticide and herbicide licenses.

We completed and submitted the *Trees Please* Grant from MidAmerica Energy. We will know in March if we have been selected and awarded the grant to plant additional trees at Creekside Park next season.

All of the Seasonal Park Maintenance Workers have finished working for the season. We had a great group of seasonal employees and couldn't accomplish what we do without them.
