Communications Department Report

Blues & BBQ

We held the first committee meeting in early March to kick off the planning season. Interest from food vendors is strong, with applications closing March 29. Our next meeting is scheduled for early April and we hope to open volunteer slots in early April as well. Blues & BBQ is scheduled for July 14, 2018, and information and volunteer opportunities will be available at northlibertyblues.org.

Storm drain painting

With the Tree and Storm Water Advisory Board's interest in painting storm drains as an educational initiative, Jillian has been working with staff and community members to put together a proposal to present at the advisory board's April 11 meeting, with implementation this summer.

Infrastructure projects

We continue to work on public awareness and direct contact with residents and business that will be affected by the numerous projects we have this year. In addition to general public awareness efforts, this year we're working closely with the residents on Front Street between Cherry and Zeller streets. As work began on the street, we hosted a meeting at the fire station to give the residents an opportunity to meet the contractor's on-site foreman, ask questions and make sure they have the contacts they need if they have problems or questions through the project. As with each construction season, we know there will be short-term inconveniences for what will be longterm and necessary improvements, and we hope to minimize those inconveniences.

Summer Activity Guide

We worked with the recreation department to put together the season activity guide, which includes that department's programming along with other community events and initiatives.

Website redesign

Development work began this month and should be in a place to begin transferring content to by late March or early April (we have a progress meeting later today). We could go live as early as mid-April, but May 1 is more likely as we work out some moving parts.

Iowa Municipal Management Institute presentation

Nick presented at the Iowa Municipal Management Institute, an annual conference put on by the Institute of Public Affairs, the Iowa City/County Management Associations and the Iowa League of Cities, on dealing with rumors, particularly on social media.

Run CRANDIC

We're focusing on hosting an official Cheer Party Zone for the first Cedar Rapids to Iowa City marathon, which comes through North Liberty (the accompanying half marathon begins here). Jillian has organizations and musicians from Liberty and North Central lined up as well as other partners. We hope those of you not running will consider joining the party on the morning of April 29 at the Community Center near Cherry Street. We'll bring the donuts.

Seniors

We included in the seasonal guide the confirmed items for Older American Month in May, which includes activities geared towards our senior population almost daily.

Other items

We provided the NoJoCo monthly paper with an updated header for the city's newsletter so it would include additional ways for members of the community to get information between newsletters.

We produced and submitted City Council meetings and League of Women Voters legislative forums to the Iowa City government and Coralville PEG channels.

We sent news releases about projects and road impacts, coming spring cleanup activities, holiday hours, closures and snow emergencies and more.
