## **Communications Department Report**

Submitted to the North Liberty City Council May 2, 2018, for the month of April 2018

#### **Blues & BBQ**

Planning for the July 14 event continues, and meetings will pick up in May. We still need to fill about 60 percent of our volunteer openings and would welcome any volunteers; we also have group fundraising opportunities available for groups of 10 or more. The team spent time preparing marketing collateral for announcements, including opening ticket sales for the Pig & Pint Prelude benefit dinner and our headliner, Grammy winner Fantastic Negrito, and more in early May. Details, including volunteer opportunities, Turkey Trot registration and Pig & Pint tickets, are available at northlibertyblues.org.

### Trash and recycling modernization

We worked with administration and Johnson County Refuse to prepare for and roll out the modernization of the city's trash and recycling system, producing a communications plan, answers to frequently asked questions, website and online option selection, displays for the library and citywide cleanup day. Like City Hall, we've fielded questions from residents (including calls, social media and emails) and worked to get answer their questions. We have additional communication planned for May focusing on the need to select a plan. We'll transition to focusing on the logistics once the selection period closes. So far, about 10 percent of North Liberty households have selected (50 percent, we're told, would be a high number of respondents) of which 60% have selected the largest, default option (the balance is split evenly between weekly and biweekly 35-gallon bins).

## Storm drain painting

Jillian has moved forward with the committee on the proposal approved by the Tree and Storm Water Advisory Board. She secured funding from MidWestOne to help fund the project. The committee met on April 30, plans to have designs from Penn and Liberty May 18 and will meet again May 23.

## Infrastructure projects

Projects are in full swing, and we continue to work to keep stakeholders informed of the plans as we're made aware of them.

#### **Run CRANDIC**

We had about 2,200 runners through our Cheer Party Zone for the first Cedar Rapids to Iowa City marathon (and half marathon. Turnout was good (and loud!) not just at the official zones (including a brunch at Tin Roost), but along the entire North Liberty Recreation Trail. We had great feedback from runners and organizers

### Website redesign

We moved content and built out pages while Maudience did development work. We're moving to have it at a place where it can launch, with additional fine tuning through the month, in early May.

#### Other items

A milestone worth a quick note: this month, we surpassed the City of lowa City's number of Facebook likes. While it's not a fair to directly compare (we have different demographics and different strategies), and there are other platforms where they're still ahead (Twitter, for example), it's a good sign that we've built a solid communication channel that reaches many constituents.

We produced the second North Liberty Bulletin, our monthly forward-looking email newsletter and sent it to about 2,000 subscribers. We saw similar open and clickthrough rates and think it can be a valuable way to connect constituents with important news and information.

We produced and submitted City Council meetings and League of Women Voters candidate forums to the Iowa City government and Coralville PEG channels.

Staff participated in the city staff day of service; collecting trash at Goose Lake.

We sent news releases about projects and road impacts, Run CRANDIC, trash changes, Older Americans Month, alternatives to citywide cleanup day and more.
