Creekside South Final Plat and Site Plan

The infrastructure improvements within the subdivision by Hodge Construction have been completed and accepted by City staff, and the final plat is ready for approval so it can be recorded. Also, the site plan was recommended for approval by the Planning Commission at their May 2 meeting, and was being held until final plat approval, so it can now be considered. The plat and site plan are located near the northwest corner of Forevergreen Road and S. Front Street, and the zoning is RM-21, multi-family. The site plan covers roughly half of a larger final plat area that extends east to Front Street, all zoned RM-21. The plan proposes 88 units on 4.71 acres, a density of 2,331 square feet of land per acre, well below the maximum density allowed in the RM-21 district of 2,000 square feet per units. The subdivision is well thought-out and the architectural design of the proposed buildings is unique and attractive. It should be noted that residents from the Creekside subdivision to the north attended the Commission meeting earlier this

Fire Chief Search

Chief Schmooke and I are recommending approval of a proposal from Moulder and Associates, which also includes services from Jeff Cayler, for the search for a full time Fire Chief. The specifics of the proposed process are outlined in the Moulder/Cayler proposal, which are included in your packet. In short, the process includes involvement by various people and groups, interviews and an assessment center, all of which will help evaluate each candidate. The estimated cost for the search process is \$16,000. While the cost is substantial, this evaluation process will be very thorough and allow us to find a candidate that will be a good fit for our fire department, organization and community. If approved, Mr. Moulder and his team will begin immediately.

Police Station Project

The agenda includes three action items related to the financing of the future police station. The first two items are a public hearing and resolution amending the City's urban renewal plan to include the construction of a new police station. Once the plan amendment is approved, the City Council can consider a resolution setting a public hearing for the issuance of up to \$5 million in GO bond funds specifically for this project. If these aforementioned resolutions are approved by Council, the next action regarding financing will be scheduled for June 23rd. Staff is recommending approval of both resolutions.

Shive Hattery is currently developing a document that will more specifically outline what a \$4 million project will provide versus a \$5 million project. This document will not be ready by Tuesday but should be available the week of the 29th. The resolutions are written so that they are not committing the City to spending \$5 million on this project; rather, these documents provide the option to spend *up to* \$5 million. If it's decided that a smaller building is more feasible or if costs on a larger building come in lower than expected, the City would only borrow what is needed, not to exceed \$5 million. This is a similar approach to how we fund other capital projects.

And finally, at our last meeting a councilor suggested we seek Requests for Qualifications/Proposals (RFQ/P) for architectural firms for this project. Staff is recommending against the RFQ/P process for this project and moving forward with Shive Hattery's architectural team. A memo is currently being drafted and will be delivered next week explaining the reasoning behind the recommendation. That said, if the Council as a whole believes we should start a consultant selection process, a decision should be made soon as the process will take a considerable amount of time. Moreover, if the Council would like to see the RFQ/P process used for other future projects we should discuss implementing such a policy.

FY2017 Budget Amendment

Each year, cities are required to amend their budgets in order to provide additional spending authority in cases where expenses are greater than budgeted. Amendments are not required for revenues; however, we include revenues projections within the amendment. Included in your packet is the budget amendment summary, which includes notes explaining the additional revenues and expenses projected

for FY 17. The substantial changes in this amendment revolve around capital projects and bond proceeds. Despite the changes, fund balances and cash reserves will stay relatively unchanged and remain strong.

Backflow Prevention Ordinance, 3rd and Final Reading

lowa Code requires cities with a population of 15,000 or more to implement a water backflow inspection program. Currently, we have approximately 400 backflow preventers installed in homes and businesses throughout the City. These units prevent water that has passed through the meter from being sucked back into the City's water system. Backflow preventers are not required on all accounts; rather, they are used in situations where there is a direct connection to an irrigation system, chemical tank or other potential for contamination. The proposed ordinance will allow the building department more discretion when it comes to requiring backflow preventers as well as establish an inspection program. The inspection itself will be completed by a third party (not the city) and staff is currently exploring an online, automated reporting process so that staff time is minimized in this process. Building Official Tom Palmer will be at Tuesday's meeting to answer questions. Since the last Council meeting and as a result of the feedback from Council, staff has added new, clarifying language to this code section. The added language is taken directly from the existing building code and is included in this section so the reader better understands the requirements specific to backflow prevention.

Electrician/Plumber License Ordinance, 3rd and Final Reading

At one time cities were responsible for issuing plumber and electrician licenses to complete work within the municipal jurisdiction. Recently, the state of lowa changed that rule and now licenses are being issued at the state level. As a result of this change, Chapter 125 of the North Liberty Code entitled "Electrician and Plumber Licenses" is irrelevant and no longer needed. Staff is recommending approval of the proposed ordinance which deletes chapter 125.

Water and Sewer Rate Adjustment Ordinances

As part of the FY 18 budget discussions earlier this year, water and sewer rates were discussed and at that time the financial model was projecting a 5% rate increase. An updated model is included in your packet, which continues to show a 5% rate increase is needed in both the water and wastewater utilities. The driving force behind these proposed rate increases continues to be the cost of the needed capital projects for each utility: new drinking water treatment plant and an expansion to the existing wastewater treatment plant. Staff is recommending approval of the ordinance amendments, which would take effect July 1, 2017.

Fireworks Legislation

Recently approved legislation legalizes the sale and use of fireworks in lowa. The legislation requires cities to provide for the sale of fireworks; however, allows for discretion by cities in terms of use within the corporate limits. This legislation was executed by the Governor on Tuesday, May 9, essentially giving cities 21 days (15 business days) to make any necessary modifications to relevant ordinances. On Tuesday, staff would like to discuss a sales moratorium with Council, which would allow staff time to prepare a zoning ordinance that would permit fireworks sales in certain zoning districts. If amenable, a moratorium resolution would be brought forward for consideration at the June 13 meeting.

Regarding use within the corporate limits, staff is recommending against, which is consistent with our current code, mainly for reasons of safety and public disturbances/complaints. Chiefs Venenga and Schmooke will be at the meeting to discuss their concerns. That said, if the majority of the Council would like to see use within the corporate limits, staff needs direction as to what, if any, restrictions or other factors should be included in a draft ordinance.

IDOT Cooperative Agreement - I380/Forevergreen Road Project

Included in your packet is an agreement with the IDOT outlining the responsibilities and cost sharing for the local road projects associated with the I380/Forevergreen Road interchange project. In summary, IDOT is responsible for design, letting and construction administration of the local road project and has agreed to pay a lump sum of \$1 million of the estimated \$6 million project. The City is responsible for the remaining \$5 million and will reimburse the IDOT, starting in FY 21, in five equal installments. The plan is to start collecting revenues for repayment purposes in FY 19, so we can spread this interest free debt over 8 years. Specifics as to the responsibilities of the IDOT and the City are outlined within the included agreement.

Staff has been negotiating this agreement with the IDOT for a better part of a year and we feel that the proposal is fair for the City, will certainly be a benefit to our local transportation system and that the project will encourage new development in that part of the City. Staff recommends approval of the proposed agreement.

North Liberty City Council May 9, 2017 Work Session Regular Session

Call to order

Mayor Terry Donahue called the May 9, 2017 Work and Regular Sessions of the North Liberty City Council to order at 6:30 p.m. Councilors present: Chris Hoffman, Sarah Madsen, Annie Pollock, Jim Sayre and Brian Wayson.

Others present: Ryan Heiar, Tracey Mulcahey, Scott Peterson, Kevin Trom, Dean Wheatley, Megan Benischek, Tionna Pooler, Acie Earl, Vince Schrock, Glen Siders, Chief Diane Venenga, Brian Gotwals, Tom Palmer, Shelby Behrens and other interested parties.

Swearing in of newly elected officials

Mayor Terry Donahue and Councilor Sarah Madsen were sworn in.

Approval of the Agenda

Wayson moved, Hoffman seconded to approve the agenda. The vote was all ayes. Agenda approved.

Consent Agenda

The vote was all ayes. Consent agenda approved.

Public Comment

No public comment was offered.

City Planner Report

City Planner Wheatley provided a fixed route service summary update. The number of trips decreased from March to April with costs remaining about the same. A joint meeting with the Planning Commission is requested to discuss approve site plans versus submitted construction plans with amendments. Council discussed the report with Wheatley.

City Engineer Report

City Engineer Trom reported on the Water System Improvements Projects. The contractor on the Water Plant project continues to pour walls, foundations, install underground plumbing and the base for the ground storage tank. Staff is traveling to Mt. Pleasant tomorrow to look at precast walls before they are delivered. The contractor on the Wells project has completed the Jordan well pump test. The results were a bit better than expected. The contractor is waiting for the engineering to certify the well pump results before removing the sound barrier. Construction of the well house has started. The Raw Water Main project will start in the summer. The North Liberty Road, Phase 2 project has slowed because of rain and poor soil conditions. The Penn Street project gas main relocation is scheduled to be completed tomorrow. The street crossings will be made the week of May 22. During heavy traffic times, two lanes will be open. After rush hour, there will be flaggers for somewhere between eight days and two weeks. The contractor for the Brine/Water Maintenance Storage project is mobilizing soon. The SRF Sponsored Water Quality Project is close to substantial completion. The Ranshaw House project design and bidding are underway. Council discussed the report with Trom.

City Attorney Report

City Attorney Peterson presented information regarding the fireworks bill that was signed into law today. Cities have the ability to opt out of allowing the use of fireworks, but cannot opt out of the sale. Heiar updated Council on staff's opinion on the use of fireworks. Staff hopes to have information for discussion and a recommendation from staff for the next City Council meeting. Peterson talked about implementing a moratorium on sales so that an ordinance can be put into effect that is reasonable and consistent with state and local codes. Council discussed the fireworks issue. Peterson presented information on the final decision in the Weinman case. He reviewed the history of the case in detail for Council. Council discussed the report with Peterson.

Assistant City Administrator Report

Assistant City Administrator Mulcahey reported that the North Liberty Summer Lunch and Fun Program begins June 5. Volunteers are still needed. Defenders of Land and Water Day was last Friday. Approximately 300 North Central Junior High 7th graders were out in the field pulling garlic mustard, water testing, doing stream clean up and underbrush removal. Mulcahey thanked the Streets Department, Parks Department, Recreation Department, and Stormwater Coordinator, Mike Wolfe for making the day a great success.

City Administrator Report

City Administrator Heiar reported that a proposal from a search firm will be on the next City Council agenda. In addition to a joint meeting with the Planning Commission, a joint meeting is needed with the Park Board to review and discuss the Aquatic Study.

Mayor Report

Mayor Donahue reported that the CITY group is meeting next Monday. He will forward a synopsis of the meeting.

2017B Bond Sale

Tionna Pooler, IPA, presented information regarding the bond sale.

Hoffman moved, Wayson seconded to approve Resolution Number 2017-48, A Resolution authorizing and approving a Loan Agreement, authorizing the call of outstanding bonds, providing for the sale and issuance of General Obligation Urban Renewal and Refunding Bonds, Series 2017B, and providing for the levy of taxes to pay the same to Wells Fargo. After discussion, the vote was: ayes – Wayson, Pollock, Madsen, Sayre, Hoffman; nays –none. Motion carried.

United Methodist Church Site Plan

Wheatley reported that Staff and the Commission recommended approval of the application as submitted. Council discussed the application with Wheatley.







This request from Hodge Construction to approve a site plan for multi-family property is located near the northwest corner of Forevergreen Road and S. Front Street. The zoning is RM-21, multi-family, and this site is roughly half of a larger overall property that extends east to Front Street, all zoned RM-21.

This plan proposes 88 units on 4.71 acres, a density of 2,331 square feet of land per acre, well above the maximum density allowed in the RM-21 district of 2,000 units per acre. Here are the numbers:

Units	#	Density
Proposed	88	2,331 Sq Ft per unit
Maximum allowed	102	2,000 Sq Ft per unit

The configuration of the site is dictated to a large degree by fire access requirements to the many units and tall buildings. Access to all units is proposed to be from the internal drives, shown as 22 and 28 feet wide with low "roll" curbs to allow vehicles access to driveways/garages, and "standing" 6-inch curbs in other areas. There is a well-developed sidewalk plan, both within the site and connecting to the public sidewalks on Forevergreen and Front.

While there seems to be a large amount of concrete on the plan, all units are designed with two-stall garages, which minimizes the number of extra surface parking spots required and will give the development a more residential look and feel.

There are three different building styles proposed:

- walkout style townhomes with rear-loading garages, along the Front Street and Forevergreen Road frontages;
- slab-on-grade style townhomes with front-facing garages, along the north property boundary adjacent to existing duplex homes; and

multi-family style buildings with 27 units (3 residential floor plus parking under); and 36 units (4 residential floors plus parking under).

All building designs feature very attractive elevations with well-designed and generous windows, roofline changes, offsets, masonry beyond minimum requirements, and a variety of materials, and will be an asset in the area.

The landscape plan is well developed and complete, and the developer paid attention to the public street frontages with landscaping, sidewalks, and attractive building fronts. Townhomes with two-stall garages give the development a very desirable scale look and feel, and provide a good mix of housing types on the site. The plan provides a transition from higher-density units within the site to the existing duplex units to the north of the site and to the town homes along the street frontages. The developer has paid attention to quality design and site features the City encourages in this plan.

This is a quality plan for high-density residential development on existing zoned land, and staff recommends approval.


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
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










SOUTHEAST RETAINING WALL CASTLE BLOCK

PROPOSED SCOPE OF SERVICES FIRE CHIEF POSITION - EXECUTIVE SEARCH

Mr. Heiar

Thank you for the invitation to submit a proposed scope of services to assist the city to identify and recruit applicants for the position of Fire Chief for North Liberty. I understand that this position is new, as it is a transition from part-time to a full-time appointment. In our previous work with your community, we assisted in the search for the Police Chief. We have successfully worked with Pleasant Hill and Spencer in the recent past to recruit Fire Chiefs.

The objective of the search process is to find applicants that have the credentials necessary, and the personality and management style that will fit with the North Liberty organization. The process starts with the creation of a Position Profile. We conduct interviews of the Mayor and Council as well as the North Liberty management team, and personnel of the North Liberty Fire Department to develop an understanding of the traits needed for success in the position. This information guides the selection process.

PROCESS

Knowledge Skills and Abilities

We can assist with the development of the job description and position requirements, including education and experience preferred.

Position Profile

The information gathered in the interview process is used to create a description of the essential traits of the ideal candidate. The traits are background, experience, education, management style, specific skills and abilities. The interview results are summarized in writing, and submitted for review by the appointing authority, for further input and comments to Moulder and Associates LLC. Those comments will result in a final Position Profile that represents a consensus of the Council, city leadership and the

department. The participation of these representatives gives ownership of the resulting appointment, and increases the probability of success for the new chief.

Application Process

We develop and place the position announcements on various websites including websites associated with the Fire Service. Emails are sent to various organizations in Iowa that will inform their members of the opportunity.

As resumes are received, we compare the applicant's information with the job requirements and position profile, to screen out candidates that are not viable. We present the viable applicants with essay questions drawn from the values identified in the Position Profile. Their responses provide the opportunity to assess the communication skills and management priorities of the applicant.

Candidates that meet the position requirements and complete the essay portion are interviewed by telephone to clarify their professional experience and evaluate their communication skills.

We rank applicants and make recommendations for candidates to continue in the process. All applications are available for review by the city, along with our recommendations. This includes the opportunity to discuss our suggestions and reasoning with appropriate city representatives. The city will make the final determination of which applicants will continue in the process.

Timeline

The process generally takes 90 days from the posting of the opening to the selection of the candidate for the position. The start date is often two to three weeks later.

ASSESSMENT PHASE

Candidates selected as finalists are invited to North Liberty to participate in this phase of the process. The City determines the steps utilized in this portion of the process.

Interview Process

Interview groups are used to evaluate the candidates. The interview groups will provide feedback of their impressions of the candidates to the appointing authority. This portion gives different perspectives of the candidates to assist in making a final decision.

Assessment Center Process

Retired Police Chief Jeff Cayler will administer the assessment center evaluation. Chief Cayler has been conducting Assessment Center procedures for over 20 years. Although most of the evaluations are performed for police chief selection and promotion, he

assisted Marshalltown, Mason City, and Spencer in the selection of their Fire Chief. We have worked together on several executive searches over the last decade.

With the assessment center process candidates are evaluated by professional fire chiefs, recruited by Chief Cayler. The evaluation is structured and uses a series of exercises to determine the candidate's writing ability, working knowledge of legal issues, departmental operations, personnel management and fire service trends. The exercises eliminate a candidate's ability to hide behind a one-dimensional talent. At the completion of the process, Chief Cayler and the assessors meet with the appointing authority to provide feedback. The appointing authority will also receive a complete written report containing the assessors' observations and scores from the process.

An example of the Assessment Center Interview Process is attached to the Proposed Scope of Services as an exhibit.

BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION

Reference checks

We will conduct preliminary personal reference and employment check, on the top candidates. These are primarily telephone contacts with previous employers and references provided by the candidate.

Background check

We will conduct a thorough background check including criminal, credit, driving and personal background history of the top one or two candidates. We conduct direct interviews of the immediate supervisors and coworkers of the candidate.

EMPLOYMENT OFFER

After a candidate is selected, we can provide assistance in the offer of employment, including the development and negotiation of the wage and benefit package.

WEEKLY REPORTS

The progress of the fire chief selection process generates frequent inquiries from the mayor, council members, fire department personnel and the public. We will email progress reports each week to keep interested parties informed.

FFFS

Fees are \$150.00 per hour plus expenses associated with the selection processes. The city administrator will be advised of expenses as they accumulate. Advertising fees and out of state travel expenses will not exceed \$2,000.

The fees for services from MOULDER AND ASSOCIATES LLC is \$14,000 plus expenses. If the city prefers to use only selected services the fees will be adjusted. We look

forward to discussing our services and we are available to meet with you and the council to address any questions.

I will ask Chief Cayler to submit a proposal for the Assessment Center process. If the city selects the Assessment Center process MOULDER AND ASSOCIATES LLC fees will be reduced by \$2,000.

Dear Ryan:

As a follow-up to my e-mail and attachments from earlier today I am submitting this proposal to have Cayler Consulting, LLC combine services with HR-One Source and Moulder and Associates for the recruitment and selection for the fire chief position for the city of North Liberty, Iowa.

Process:

I will recruit three Iowa fire chiefs/administrators to serve as assessors for a one day assessment center process. Using information obtained from the position analysis and discussions with city staff, I will prepare a series of exercises that are designed to simulate duties or tasks that might occur during a normal workday for a fire chief. These exercises are designed to assess the candidates' knowledge, skills and ability to perform in situations that would be typical for a fire chief. The exercises are designed to assess the candidates' oral communications skills, writing ability, working knowledge of legal issues, departmental operations, personnel management and fire service trends. These varied exercises help eliminate a candidate's ability to hide behind a one dimensional talent.

At the conclusion of the assessment center Chief Cayler and the other assessors will meet with representatives of the city and go over the outcome of the process and discuss their views on each of the candidates. A final report will be prepared and submitted to the city detailing the results of the assessment center if requested.

Fees:

Generally speaking, the cost for my services and the assessment center process as a whole will include payment for meals, mileage and motel rooms (if needed) for each of the assessors and me. When I recruit outside chiefs/administrators to serve as assessors

and/or interviewers I normally have the city pay each of these assessors a stipend in the amount of \$350/day for their involvement in this process (please see Assessor Fees below). I am assuming a one-day assessment. There will also be a small charge for printing, copies and other incidentals to be used in the assessment process. An estimate of the cost of the assessment center process is shown below:

ASSESSOR FEES. I will attempt to recruit fire chiefs/administrators to serve as assessors on a volunteer basis on behalf of their cities. If successful, there will be no costs other than mileage, motel and meal expenses for these individuals. If I am not able to recruit assessors on a volunteer basis I will have the client pay each of the three recruited chiefs/assessors a stipend of \$350 per day (one day assessment) plus reasonable expenses for meals, mileage, motels, etc. Mileage will be paid at the current IRS rate of \$.535/mile. The estimated costs for assessors are as follows:

THE ASSESSMENT CENTER - A Measure of Competence

The assessment center testing process provides an accurate measurement of a candidate's competence to perform a given task, function or undertaking in a predictable manner. Typically, Chief Cayler and two additional law enforcement or fire service administrators will assess selected candidates' abilities in a one-day assessment center process. Using information obtained from questionnaires, the position profile and discussions with city staff, Chief Cayler will prepare a series of exercises that are designed to simulate duties or tasks that might occur during a normal workday for a given position or rank. These exercises are designed to assess the candidates' ability to perform in situations that would be typical for a person in that position. They are also designed to assess the candidates' writing ability and working knowledge of legal issues, departmental operations, personnel management, and law enforcement and/or fire service trends. An assessment center process:

- Levels the playing field by providing all candidates an equal opportunity to demonstrate their competency
- Provides for an objective, disinterested view from professional evaluators
- Places the candidate in a controlled environment
- Establishes a reliable prediction of performance through the use of a definable set of measurements of a candidate's competence
- Builds multi-layered tasks --- ability to measure a candidate's competency in several areas at once
- Defeats a candidate's ability in hide behind a one-dimensional talent
- Mirrors real world scenarios in a controlled manner

CRITICAL MANAGEMENT DIMENSIONS

Each assessment exercise is designed to measure the candidate's level of competence within three or more of 11 Critical Management Dimensions (competencies). Management Dimensions are those elements of competence that are relevant within the specific function of supervising and managing operations or personnel. (i.e.: What important abilities and skills are required in order to fulfill the position?)

Critical Management Dimensions are identified as:

Analysis: The determination of core elements. Relating and comparing information from different sources, identifying issues, securing relevant information and identifying relationships.

Initiative: Actively attempts to influence events to achieve goals; self-starting rather than passively accepting. Taking action to achieve goals beyond what is necessarily called for; originating action. Following through energetically.

Judgment: The capacity to make high quality decisions which are based on logical assumptions and which reflect factual information. A conclusion based on a discriminating appraisal of known information.

Leadership: Utilizing appropriate interpersonal styles and methods of communication in order to set a course or vision for an organization. To guide individuals or groups towards task accomplishment or acceptance of an idea demonstrating "big picture" thinking; vision.

Oral Communication Skills: Effective expression in individual or group situations, whether spontaneous or when given time for preparation (includes both verbal and non-verbal cues).

Planning and Organization: Establishing a course of action for self and/or others to accomplish a specific goal; planning proper assignments of personnel and appropriate allocation of resources or assets. A process of order; a method worked out beforehand.

Written Communication Skills: Clear expression of ideas in writing.

At the conclusion of the assessment center, Chief Cayler and the other assessors will meet with representatives of the city and go over the outcome of the process and discuss their views on each of the candidates. A final written report is also generated discussing the process and the results of the assessment center.

The City Council of the City of North Liberty, Iowa, will meet on June 13, 2017, at the Council Chambers, North Liberty, Iowa, at 6:30 p.m., for the purpose of instituting proceedings and taking action on a proposal to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") and to borrow money thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 for the purpose of paying the cost, to that extent, of undertaking an urban renewal project in the North Liberty Urban Renewal Area consisting of constructing, furnishing and equipping a new police station.

The Loan Agreement is proposed to be entered into pursuant to authority contained in Section 384.24A and Section 384.24.3(q) of the Code of Iowa and will constitute a general obligation of the City.

At any time before the date fixed for taking action to enter into the Loan Agreement, a petition may be filed with the City Clerk of the City asking that the question of entering into the Loan Agreement be submitted to the registered voters of the City, pursuant to the provisions of Section 384.26 of the Code of Iowa. If no such petition is filed, at the aforementioned time and place, oral or written objections may be filed or made to the proposal to enter into the Loan Agreement. After receiving objections, the City may determine to enter into the Loan Agreement, in which case, the decision will be final unless appealed to the District Court within fifteen (15) days thereafter.

Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Income Tax Regulations (the "Regulations") of the Internal Revenue Service, the City declares (a) that it intends to undertake the Project which is reasonably estimated to cost approximately \$5,000,000, (b) that other than (i) expenditures to be paid or reimbursed from sources other than the issuance of bonds, notes or other obligations (the "Bonds"), or (ii) expenditures made not earlier than 60 days prior to the date of this Resolution or a previous intent resolution of the City, or (iii) expenditures amounting to the lesser of \$100,000 or 5% of the proceeds of the Bonds, or (iv) expenditures constituting preliminary expenditures as defined in Section 1.150-2(f)(2) of the Regulations, no expenditures for the Project has heretofore been made by the City and no expenditures will be made by the City until after the date of this Resolution or a prior intent resolution of the City, and (c) that the City reasonably expects to reimburse the expenditures made for costs of the City out of the proceeds of the Bonds. This declaration is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Regulations.

Section 6. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval, as provided by law.



Backflow Prevention Ordinance



Ordinance No. 2017-03

AN ORDINANCE ADDING CHAPTER 90 OF THE NORTH LIBERTY CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ADDRESS BACKFLOW PREVENTION IN CITY'S WATER SERVICE SYSTEM

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH LIBERTY, IOWA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Chapter 90, "Water Service System," of the North Liberty Code of Ordinances (2016) is hereby amended by adding Section 90.21, "Backflow Prevention," to read as follows:

90.21 BACKFLOW PREVENTION.

- 1. Definitions. For use in this section, terms are defined in the current International Plumbing Code, as adopted and amended in Chapter 157 of this Code.
- 2. Applicability. A potable water supply system shall be designed, installed and maintained in such a manner so as to prevent contamination from nonpotable liquids, solids or gases being introduced into the potable water supply through cross connections or any other piping connections to the system.
 - A. The potable water supply to automatic fire sprinkler and standpipe systems shall be protected against backflow by a double check backflow prevention assembly, a double check fire protection backflow prevention assembly or a reduced pressure principle fire protection backflow prevention assembly.
 - B. The potable water supply to lawn irrigation systems shall be protected against backflow by an atmospheric vacuum breaker, a pressure vacuum breaker assembly or a reduced pressure principle backflow prevention assembly. Valves shall not be installed downstream from an atmospheric vacuum breaker. Where chemicals are introduced into the system, the potable water supply shall be protected against backflow by a reduced pressure principle backflow prevention assembly.
 - C. Where a potable water connection is made to a nonpotable line, fixture, tank, vat, pump or other equipment subject to high hazard backpressure, the potable water connection shall be protected by a reduced pressure principle backflow prevention assembly.
 - D. Where chemical dispensers connect to the potable water distribution system, the water supply system shall be protected against backflow in accordance with plumbing code.

- E. Where the portable cleaning equipment connects to the water distribution system, the water supply system shall be protected against backflow in accordance with the plumbing code.
- F. Where dental pumping equipment connects to the water distribution system, the water supply system shall be protected against backflow in accordance with the plumbing code.
- G. The water supply connection to coffee machines and noncarbonated beverage dispensers shall be protected against backflow by a backflow preventer conforming to ASSE 1022 or by an air gap.
- 3. Devices. Reduced pressure principle, double check, pressure vacuum breaker, reduced pressure detector fire protection, double check detector fire protection, and spill-resistant vacuum breaker backflow preventer assemblies and hose connection backflow preventers shall be tested at the time of installation, immediately after repairs or relocation, and at least annually.
- 4. Responsibility for Administration. The Building Official shall administer, implement, and enforce the provisions of this section. Any powers granted or duties imposed upon the Building Official may be delegated by the Building Official to persons or entities acting in the beneficial interest of or in the employ of the City.
- 5. Right of Entry. The Building Official shall be permitted access to a customer's premises, upon showing proper identification or upon search warrant by a court of appropriate jurisdiction, as often as necessary to ensure compliance with this section.
- 6. New Water Services and Modifications to Existing Services. Prior to the issuance of a building permit, the contractor/builder shall submit plans for a new water service or modifications to an existing service to the Building Official for review. The Building Official shall determine the type of backflow prevention assembly required for containment based upon the degree of hazard. The Building Official shall require the installation of the appropriate backflow prevention assembly for containment prior to the initiation of water service.
- 7. Containment/Isolation. All customers whose premises are not classified as single-family residential by the Building Official shall be inspected by the Building Official to determine the type and degree of hazard to the water system. Upon conclusion of the inspection, the Building Official shall determine the type of backflow prevention assembly required to achieve containment and isolation. Upon written notice, the customer, at the customer's own expense, shall install all backflow prevention assemblies mandated by the Building Official.
- 8. Annual Report and Inspection by Customer. When a water service is initially installed or an existing water service is modified, the service shall be tested and approved by the Building Official. Every twelve (12) months thereafter, the

customer shall submit to the Building Official a report from a registered backflow prevention assembly technician, certifying that containment and isolation on the customer's premises have been achieved.

9. Annual Certification Fee. For each annual certification report, as required in Paragraph 6, the customer shall pay a fee, the amount for which shall be set by resolution of the City Council.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All Ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.





This Agreement, is entered into by and between the Iowa Department of Transportation, hereinafter designated the "DOT", and the City of North Liberty, Iowa, a Local Public Agency, hereafter designated the "LPA" in accordance with Iowa Code Chapters 28E, 306, 306A and 313.4 as applicable;

The DOT proposes to establish or make improvements to the W. Forevergreen Road local roadway from just east of Kansas Avenue (east end of I-380/Forevergreen Road Interchange project) to S. Jones Blvd.;

The DOT and the LPA are willing to jointly participate in said projects, in the manner hereinafter provided;

The DOT and the LPA have entered into Agreement No. 2017-1-145, which is for right of way acquisition for construction of a new interchange on I-380 at W. Forevergreen Road in Johnson County, North Liberty; and

This Agreement reflects the current concepts of these projects which are subject to modification by mutual agreement between the LPA and the DOT.

Therefore, it is agreed as follows:

1. Project Information

a. The DOT will design, let, and inspect construction of the following described projects in accordance with the project plans, and DOT standard specifications, except as noted herein:

Construction of local road improvements on W. Forevergreen Road, hereafter referred to as Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements, necessary for incident management during reconstruction of the I-380/I-80 interchange. The W. Forevergreen Road Local Road projects are to be consistent with the LPA's long range plan and include conversion of W. Forevergreen Road, from east of Kansas Avenue to near Jones Boulevard, to a minimum of a three-lane paved roadway. The Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements are comprised of two projects:

- Project (337) from east of Kansas Ave to near Covered Bridge Blvd
- Project (321) from near Covered Bridge Blvd to near Jones Blvd

See Exhibit A for location and graphic representation of the projects [Project (337) in yellow and Project (321) in green].

See Exhibit B for roadway costs to be shared by the DOT and LPA (first page) and the total project costs (second page).

Projects related to the construction of the Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements include wetland bank mitigation hereafter referred to as Project (333), and stream mitigation hereafter referred to as Project (334).

2. Jurisdictional Responsibilities for the Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements

- a. Improvements will be necessary on W. Forevergreen Road for use in incident management during the construction of the future I-80/I380 interchange. The DOT will be responsible for the costs of design, survey, environmental services, right-of-way acquisition, and construction of the future I-80/380 interchange and the I-80 Forevergreen Road interchange. Therefore, the DOT and the LPA agree to the below division of responsibilities for Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements.
- b. The DOT will be the lead agency for the design, survey, environmental services, right of way acquisition, construction administration, and inspection for the Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements except as noted below. The DOT will obtain concurrence from the LPA on the proposed improvements.
- c. The DOT shall be responsible for the cost of design, survey, environmental services, and engineering up to project letting. This excludes LPA costs for planning, design, and engineering for the following:
 - Coordination with the DOT.
 - (2) Review of project related documents.
 - (3) LPA-owned utilities.
- d. The DOT shall provide right of way acquisition services (right of way design, appraisals, negotiations, title and closing, and condemnation) for the Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements. The LPA shall be responsible for the preparation of land survey plats, and any legal proceedings subsequent to a decision made by the Johnson County Compensation Commission (DOT staff shall be available as witnesses and provide information), and the acquisition costs for property, and relocation.
- e. The DOT will provide a proposed cost estimate to acquire each parcel of land based on an appraisal or appraisal waiver to the LPA for concurrence. The LPA's concurrence will include the ability for the DOT to make an administrative settlement on any parcels up to an additional 10%. Any settlement above 10% shall first be approved by the LPA designated representative. The LPA's designated representative shall provide buyer's approval on the purchase agreements.
- f. The LPA is responsible for coordination with public and private utilities to determine utility easement needs and acceptability of utility relocation proposals. The LPA will provide the DOT proposed utility easement layout and ownership information for DOT coordination in the ROW appraisal and negotiation process.
- g. The DOT shall provide and be responsible for the construction administration and inspection for the Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements projects, except for LPA-owned utilities (LPA owned utilities include water main and sanitary sewer) included in the project. The LPA shall be responsible for the inspection and acceptance of LPA-owned utilities.
- h. As background for the final project cost sharing agreement set out in Section 3, the DOT and the LPA originally agreed that the DOT would be responsible for approximately 25% of the eligible roadway construction items between the curbs. Further, the parties agreed that the LPA should be responsible for 100% of the construction costs for LPA-owned utilities, which are sanitary and storm sewer, water, lighting, sidewalks, and aesthetic features and, with exception to a portion of construction included in the DOT cost share described in Section 3(a) and 3(b) herein, all other construction costs for work outside of the back-of-curb, including clearing and grubbing, topsoil, and driveways and as noted in Exhibit B as 100% LPA funded items.

3. Project Costs

- a. The DOT is responsible for the costs of Project (333) for Wetland Bank Mitigation and Project (334) for Stream Mitigation required for the Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements project. The total costs for these projects is estimated at \$75,000.
- b. In addition to the DOT's responsibility for the \$75,000 for the mitigation projects, the DOT and LPA agree that a Lump Sum amount of \$1,000,000 represents a mutually acceptable share of DOT construction costs for roadway improvements items described in Section 2(h) above and shown in Exhibit B as costs that are the responsibility of the DOT. The LPA shall be responsible for the remainder of the Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements costs. The total Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements costs (construction and right-of-way but excluding the mitigation project costs set out in 3(a)) are estimated at \$5,928,115 with the LPA share estimated at \$4,928,115 (estimated 2017 costs projected to 2018 with 4% per year inflation for construction).
- c. The DOT will make construction progress payments to the awarded contractors based on anticipated construction bid lettings of July 2017 for Project (337) and July 2018 for Project (321).
- d. LPA reimbursement to the DOT for construction cost of roadway improvements will be made in five (5) equal yearly installments of approximately \$1,001,847 each. The first installment will be due upon completion of construction and proper billing by the DOT or July 15, 2021, whichever is later. The final four installments will be billed to the LPA one, two, three and four years subsequent to the date of the first billing respectively. The actual amount of reimbursement will be determined by the quantities in place and the accepted bid at the contract letting. No interest will be charged. LPA will begin making provision to fund its payments required under this section through the property tax system as soon as possible.
- e. LPA reimbursement to the DOT for construction costs of public utilities for water main and sanitary sewer construction will be due upon completion of construction and proper billing by the DOT. Estimated construction costs (2017 estimated costs projected to 2018 with 4% per year inflation for construction) for water main construction is on Project (337) \$159,000 and on Project (321) \$163,500 and for sanitary sewer construction is on Project (321) \$163,500 for a total public utilities construction cost estimate of \$462,200. The actual amount of reimbursement will be determined by the quantities in place and the accepted bid at the contract letting.

4. Traffic Control

- a. For I-380/W. Forevergreen Road Interchange construction, I-380 through-traffic will be maintained. Forevergreen Road will remain open during much of the construction of the interchange but will require a roadway closure with detour to connect the new roadway and bridge to the existing roadway. This connection includes the closure of the Kansas Avenue at W. Forevergreen Road intersection for reconstruction of the grade through the intersection.
- b. For Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements projects construction, W. Forevergreen Road will be closed to through-traffic for both Project (337) and Project (321). Local traffic will be detoured during construction of the W. Forevergreen Road Local Road Improvements projects with accommodation to maintain local access to properties.
- c. If it becomes necessary to temporarily close W. Forevergreen Road and any LPA streets related to the project during construction, the DOT will furnish and install the required barricades and signing for the closure at project cost, and shall remove same upon completion of the project also at no expense or obligation to the LPA. The DOT will work in close cooperation with the LPA and the contractor to accommodate emergency services and local access across the project during construction.
- d. Any detours which may be necessary for LPA street closures will be the responsibility of the LPA, all

at no expense or obligation to the DOT.

5. Right-of-Way

In connection with this project, any real estate and rights to real estate necessary for right of way for city streets, alleys, access roads or frontage roads, and any permanent utility easements which are or which will be under the jurisdiction of the LPA may be acquired by the DOT for and in the name of the LPA. Where acquired by contract the LPA will receive title from the contract seller and the LPA will accept title thereto.

6. Bid Letting

- a. The project will be let by the DOT in accordance with its normal letting procedures. The LPA shall comply with the public hearing requirements of the lowa Code section 26.12.
- b. When let by the DOT, the DOT will identify the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. The DOT will provide an electronic tabulation of responsive bids to the LPA for concurrence. The LPA shall take action to accept the award to the lowest responsive bidder. The LPA shall provide such confirmation by email. Following LPA concurrence in the award of contract, the DOT shall execute the contract.
- c. The DOT shall be the contracting authority for the project.

7. Construction & Maintenance

- a. The LPA, in cooperation with the DOT, will take whatever steps may be required with respect to alteration of the grade lines of the new highway facilities constructed under the project in accordance with lowa Code section 364.15. The DOT and LPA will work together to minimize potential impacts to properties that may occur as a result of the project.
- b. Lighting installations will not be constructed as part of the project unless specifically requested by the LPA. Lighting which is requested by the LPA will also be paid for entirely by the LPA at no cost to the DOT. If constructed, the LPA shall accept ownership of and responsibility for future energy and maintenance costs of lighting units which lie within the corporate boundaries.
- c. Traffic signals are not warranted within the W. Forevergreen Local Road Improvements project and are not part of this project.

8. General Provisions

- a. The LPA will comply with all provisions of the equal employment opportunity requirements prohibiting discrimination and requiring affirmative action to assure equal employment opportunity as required by lowa Code Chapter 216. No person will, on the grounds of age, race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, religion, pregnancy, or disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which State funds are used.
- b. It is the intent of both parties that no third party beneficiaries be created by this Agreement.
- c. If any section, provision, or part of this Agreement shall be found to be invalid or unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the validity of the Agreement as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not found to be invalid or unconstitutional, except to the extent that the original intent of the Agreement cannot be fulfilled.
- d. This Agreement may be executed in two counterparts, each of which so executed will be deemed to be an original.

e.	This Agreement, as well as the unaffected provisions of any previous agreements, addendums, and/or amendments; represents the entire Agreement between the LPA and DOT regarding this project. All previously executed agreements will remain in effect except as amended herein. Any subsequent change or modification to the terms of this Agreement will be in the form of a duly executed amendment to this document.






Monthly Report Summarization

April 30, 2017

This report provides a summarization of the budget status after the end of April 2017. At the end of this month, the City is 83.33% through the budget year. The red line indicates the percentage where the budget area is and green/blue line is the percentage of the budget year. Any particular area falling approximately 10% below or above the percentage of the budget year will be explained below. The data includes the amended budget.


Revenues: The following chart demonstrates the condition of the City's budgeted revenues as of April 30, 2017:



- This chart represents the historical view at the end of April. The City received the first half of the property tax revenue in October and the second half in April.
- Stormwater revenues are significantly higher than the amended amount due to the SRF Sponsored Water Quality Soil Quality Restoration Project reimbursement coming in early May.

Overall revenues for the year to date are \$44,141,208.24, 57.51% of the budgeted amount. This amount is less than the budgeted mark. The final borrowing of 2017 and end of year transfers will bring this number in line with projected amounts.

Expenditures: The following chart demonstrates the condition of the City's budgeted expenditures as of April 30, 2017:



- Public Safety is below projected due to end of year transfers.
- Health and Social Service expenses are higher due to the payment to the Food Pantry and the School Family Resource Centers and other social service payments in July and August.
- Culture and Recreation is below projected expenditures for the year. End of year transfers will bring this number onto the budget target.
- Community and Economic Development are below projected budget due to some contributions budgeted not being necessary in FY 17.
- Road Use Tax expenditures are lower than expected due to end of year transfers.

• Stormwater Utility expenses are lower than projected for a budgetary cushion for the Soil Quality Restoration Program.

Year to date total expenditures are \$33,595,516.36 or 42.38% of the projected budget amounts. This amount is less than the 83.33% of the fiscal year completed due to expenditures and transfers occurring later in the fiscal year.

Following is the Treasurer's Report for April. The General Fund Balance is comprised of more than just the 010 General Fund. For accounting purposes of the budget and reporting, other funds such as Library Capital, Fire Capital and others are incorporated into the General total. The General Fund for operating expenses has a fund balance of \$ 4,765,427.87. The other funds in the total shown here are obligated to specific departments or types of activities. The other funds are separated out to keep those obligations clear for future expenditures.
