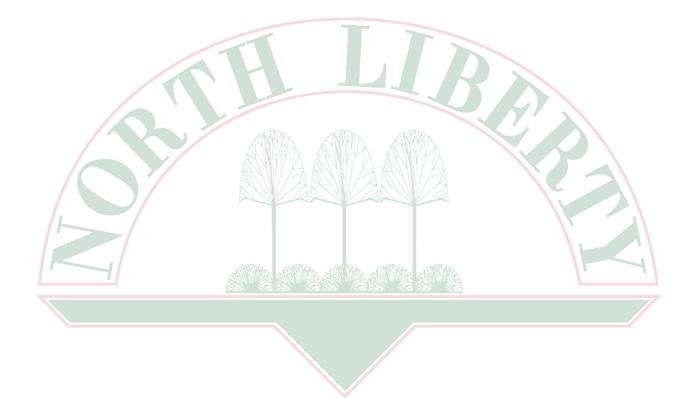

#### Penn and Front Street Corridor Improvements: Easements

The Penn and Front Street Corridor Improvements project includes the construction of two full-sized roundabouts (one at Penn and Front Streets and the other at Front Street and North Bend Drive) and various sight distance improvements on Penn Street, and requires a handful of easements and acquisitions. The easement on this agenda, which is recommending for approval, is a temporary construction easement with ICCSD allowing the City to use a portion of their property to stage and store equipment and materials.

## **Main Street Project: Easements**

The Main Street project includes the reconstruction of Main Street between Cherry and Dubuque Streets, including curb, gutter, sidewalks and various other water, sewer and storm water improvements. Below is a summary of the temporary construction easements included on this agenda:

### **Main Street Vacation**

With the design of the police station and the Main Street improvements projects happening concurrently, staff and consultants determined that the right-of-way in front of the Police Station property could be reduced without any negative impacts to the roadway and to the benefit of the police station project. Staff recommends vacating 10 feet of the street right-of-way (going from 80 feet to 70) to the adjacent police station site. This agenda includes a public heating and a resolution finalizing the vacation.

# **Upcoming Street Projects**

The agenda includes two public hearings and two resolutions approving the plans and specifications for the Penn and Front Street project and the Main Street project. Bids for both projects will be received in February and it is anticipated that construction will start as soon as weather allows. Staff recommends approval of the resolutions.

### **North Front Street Right-Of-Way Vacation**

Staff is recommending the vacation of approximately 1.2 acres of right-of-way on the west side of the North Front Street curve, adjacent to the new Christine Grant Elementary School. The existing right-of-way exceeds what the City requires or needs, thus it makes sense to transfer the property to the school district for their use. Included in the packet is an exhibit identifying the proposed property to be vacated as well as an ordinance to vacate the property.

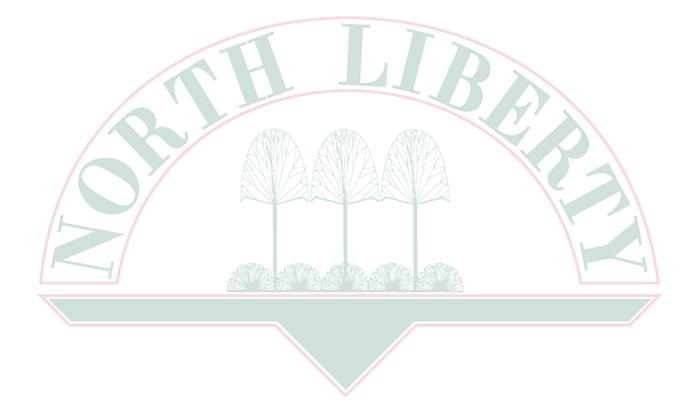
### **City Council Vacancy**

Councilman Jim Sayre has submitted his resignation, effective February 1, 2019 as he and his family are moving to Arizona. The City Council has the option to appoint a new Councilor to serve through the next City election (November 2019) or to hold a special election in which case the newly elected official would serve the remainder of Councilor Sayre's term through December 2019. Included in the packet is a more detailed explanation of the Council's options to fill the upcoming vacancy. Staff is seeking direction from the Council so that a process to fill the soon-to-be vacated seat can begin.

## **FY18 General Fund Balance**

The FY 18 audit confirms a year-end general fund balance of \$5.8 million, 45% of the City's general fund revenues. The newly adopted Fund Balance policy states that the City Council should allocate any reserve funds in excess of 30% of the next year's revenues, in this case totaling approximately \$1.99 million. Included in the packet is a spreadsheet summarizing the general fund balance in terms of dollars and percentage and identifying potential projects in which to allocate the funding. The projects identified in the red box are those that staff feel are most important from an operational standpoint, while the others are projects that have been identified as a priority or discussed previously. Staff is seeking direction from Council on Tuesday on how to allocate the funding.

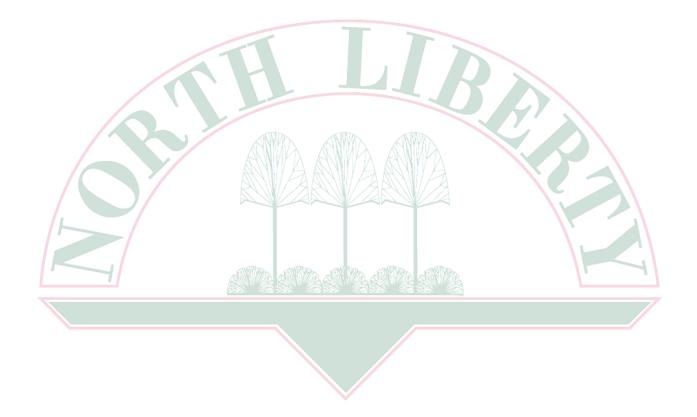

#### <u>Call to order</u>

Mayor Terry Donahue called the January 8, 2019 Regular Session of the North Liberty City Council to order. Councilors present: Jennifer Goings, Chris Hoffman, Sarah Madsen, and Jim Sayre; absent: Annie Pollock.

Others present: Ryan Heiar, Tracey Mulcahey, Kevin Trom, Dean Wheatley, Joel Miller, Diane Venenga, James Estes, Scott Hardwick, Aaron Klosterman, Kevin Digmann and other interested parties.

#### Approval of the Agenda

Madsen moved, Sayre seconded to approve the agenda. The vote was all ayes. Agenda approved.

#### <u>Consent Agenda</u>

#### <u>City Planner Report</u>

City Planner Dean Wheatley reported on the updated City street map that was included in the Council packet.

#### <u>City Engineer Report</u>

City Engineer Kevin Trom reported that the last part of the Forevergreen Road project will be bid a week from tomorrow in Ames. The Highway 965, Phase 3 final walk through will be on Monday with IDOT, City staff and the contractor. The Penn and Front Street Project final owner review meeting was held last month. The bid documents will be released tomorrow. Alliant and Mediacom have begun work undergrounding utilities for the project. The public hearing will be held at the next regular Council meeting with construction starting in late March. The Main Street project final owner review meeting is tomorrow. Bid documents will be issued next week. The design work has begun on the 2019 Trail Projects. Council discussed the report with Trom.

#### Assistant City Administrator Report

Assistant City Administrator Tracey Mulcahey reported that the audit is on tonight's agenda. Cross Park Place Open House is scheduled for Wednesday, January 16.

#### **City Administrator Report**

City Administrator Ryan Heiar reported that the City Attorney agreement is in the packet tonight. Colin Smith will be in town tomorrow to do final paperwork. His start date will be provided soon. Meetings in January are January 15 at 5:30 on budget, January 22 regular meeting and January 29 on CIP. The Joint Meeting of Johnson County entities will be hosted by Johnson County on January 14 starting at 4:00 p.m. Heiar reported that a photo of the updated aquatic play feature is in the packet. This is an upgrade to the outdoor pool. The funds are available to make it happen including installation. He requested that the Iowa City Community School District easement agreement be removed from tonight's agenda as the agreement is still being finalized.

#### <u>Mayor Report</u>

Mayor Terry Donahue reported he attended the Diventures Groundbreaking and the Fire Department Badge and Bugle ceremony. He will be attending the Fair Play economic alliance formal agreement signing on Friday morning at 7:30 a.m. The Transportation Committee meeting minutes and RFP were included in the Council packet. If no questions, the Committee will start working on contract. Councilor Jim Sayre has tendered his resignation. He will be leaving on February 1. Filling Councilor Sayre's position will be on the January 22 agenda.

#### Police Department Project

Jim Estes and Chief Diane Venenga presented information on the project. Council discussed the project with Estes and Venenga.

Madsen moved, Goings seconded to approve Resolution Number 2019-01, A Resolution accepting the bid and authorizing execution of the contract for the Police Department Project, North Liberty, Iowa. The vote was: ayes - Hoffman, Goings, Sayre, Madsen; nays – none. Motion carried.

Hoffman moved, Sayre seconded to approve Resolution Number 2019-02, A Resolution authorizing execution of Change Order Number One for the Contract with Tricon General Construction for the Police Department Project, North Liberty, Iowa. WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of North Liberty, Iowa, has heretofore given preliminary approval to the plans, specifications, and estimate of cost (the "Contract Documents") for the proposed Penn and Front Corridor Improvements Project (the "Project"), as described in the notice of hearing on the Contract Documents for the Project and the taking of bids therefor; and

WHEREAS, a hearing has been held on the Contract Documents on January 22, 2019;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of North Liberty, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby delegates to the City Clerk and/or the Project Engineer the duty of receiving bids for the Project until 10:00 o'clock a.m. on February 5, 2019 at the City Administration Building in the City. At such time and place the City Clerk and/or the Project Engineer open such bids received and announce the results thereof. The City Council will consider bids received at the City Council meeting to be held on February 12, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. at City Council Chambers in the City.

Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of the hearing and taking of bids by publication as required by law, which publication shall be made not less than 4 and not more than 45 days prior to the date for receipt of bids and not less than 4 and not more than 20 days prior to the date of the said hearing. The said notice shall be in the form substantially as attached to this resolution.

Section 3. "Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Income Tax Regulations (the "Regulations") of the Internal Revenue Service, the City declares (a) that it intends to undertake the Project, (b) that other than (i) expenditures to be paid or reimbursed from sources other than the issuance of bonds, notes or other obligations (the "Bonds"), or (ii) expenditures made not earlier than 60 days prior to the date of this Resolution or a previous intent resolution of the City, or (iii) expenditures amounting to the lesser of \$100,000 or 5% of the proceeds of the Bonds, or (iv) expenditures constituting preliminary expenditures as defined in Section 1.150-2(f)(2) of the Regulations, no expenditures for the Project have heretofore been made by the City and no expenditures will be made by the City until after the date of this Resolution or a prior intent resolution of the City, and (c) that the City reasonably expects to reimburse the expenditures made for costs of the City out of the proceeds of the Bonds. This declaration is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Regulations.

Section 4. The Contract Documents referred to in the preamble hereof are hereby finally approved, and the prior action of the City Council giving preliminary approval is hereby finally confirmed, and the Project, as provided for in the Contract Documents, is necessary and desirable.

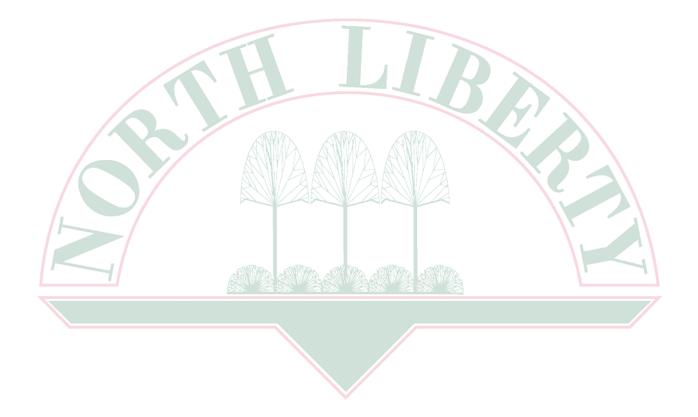

#### **RESOLUTION FINALLY APPROVING AND CONFIRMING PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, AND ESTIMATE OF COST FOR THE MAIN STREET IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of North Liberty, Iowa, has heretofore given preliminary approval to the plans, specifications, and estimate of cost (the "Contract Documents") for the proposed Main Street Improvements Project (the "Project"), as described in the notice of hearing on the Contract Documents for the Project and the taking of bids therefor; and

WHEREAS, a hearing has been held on the Contract Documents on January 22, 2019;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of North Liberty, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby delegates to the City Clerk and/or the Project Engineer the duty of receiving bids for the Project until 11:00 o'clock a.m. on February 12, 2019 at the City Administration Building in the City. At such time and place the City Clerk and/or the Project Engineer open such bids received and announce the results thereof. The City Council will consider bids received at the City Council meeting to be held on February 26, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. at City Council Chambers in the City.

Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of the hearing and taking of bids by publication as required by law, which publication shall be made not less than 4 and not more than 45 days prior to the date for receipt of bids and not less than 4 and not more than 20 days prior to the date of the said hearing. The said notice shall be in the form substantially as attached to this resolution.

Section 3. "Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Income Tax Regulations (the "Regulations") of the Internal Revenue Service, the City declares (a) that it intends to undertake the Project, (b) that other than (i) expenditures to be paid or reimbursed from sources other than the issuance of bonds, notes or other obligations (the "Bonds"), or (ii) expenditures made not earlier than 60 days prior to the date of this Resolution or a previous intent resolution of the City, or (iii) expenditures amounting to the lesser of \$100,000 or 5% of the proceeds of the Bonds, or (iv) expenditures constituting preliminary expenditures as defined in Section 1.150-2(f)(2) of the Regulations, no expenditures for the Project have heretofore been made by the City and no expenditures will be made by the City until after the date of this Resolution of the City, and (c) that the City reasonably expects to reimburse the expenditures made for costs of the City out of the proceeds of the Bonds. This declaration is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Regulations.

Section 4. The Contract Documents referred to in the preamble hereof are hereby finally approved, and the prior action of the City Council giving preliminary approval is hereby finally confirmed, and the Project, as provided for in the Contract Documents, is necessary and desirable.

#### Ordinance No. 2019-01

#### AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF RIGHT OF WAY IN NORTH LIBERTY, IOWA

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH LIBERTY, IOWA:

**SECTION 1. PURPOSE.** The purpose of this ordinance is to vacate a portion of right of way as described on the attached plat and convey it to the adjoining property owner, the City. Such vacation has been approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

**SECTION 2. FINDINGS.** The City Council of North Liberty, Iowa, hereby makes the following findings:

A. That the City of North Liberty held a public hearing on the proposal to vacate of the public land legally described as:

A PORTION OF MAIN STREEET IN THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 12, TOWNSHIP 80 NORTH, RANGE 7 WEST, OF THE FIFTH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, NORTH LIBERTY, IOWA, DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

Commencing at the East Quarter Corner of Section 12, Township 80 North, Range 7 West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, North Liberty, Johnson County, Iowa; Thence S01°14'52"E, along the East Line of the Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 12, a distance of 837.00 feet, to the North east Corner of Lot 4 of the "Subdivision of the Northeast ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of Section 12", as Recorded in Plat Book 1 at Page 2 of the Records of the Johnson County Recorder's Office; Thence N89°10'54"W, along the North Line of said Lot 4, a distance 408.79 feet, to the Northwest Corner of said Lot 4, and the Point of Beginning; Thence S01°01'10"E, along the Easterly Right-of-way of Main Street, 435.28 feet, to its intersection with the North Right-of-Way Line of Cherry Street; Thence S88°59'05"W, along the Westerly Projection of said North Right-of-Way Line, 10.00 feet; Thence N01°01'10"W, along a line parallel with and 10.00 feet normally distant Westerly from Said Easterly Rightof-Way Line of Main Street, 435.60 feet, to its intersection with the Westerly Projection of the North Line of said Lot 4; Thence S89°10'54"E, along said Westerly Projection 10.01 feet, to the Point of Beginning. **SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY.** If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

**SECTION 5. WHEN EFFECTIVE.** This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

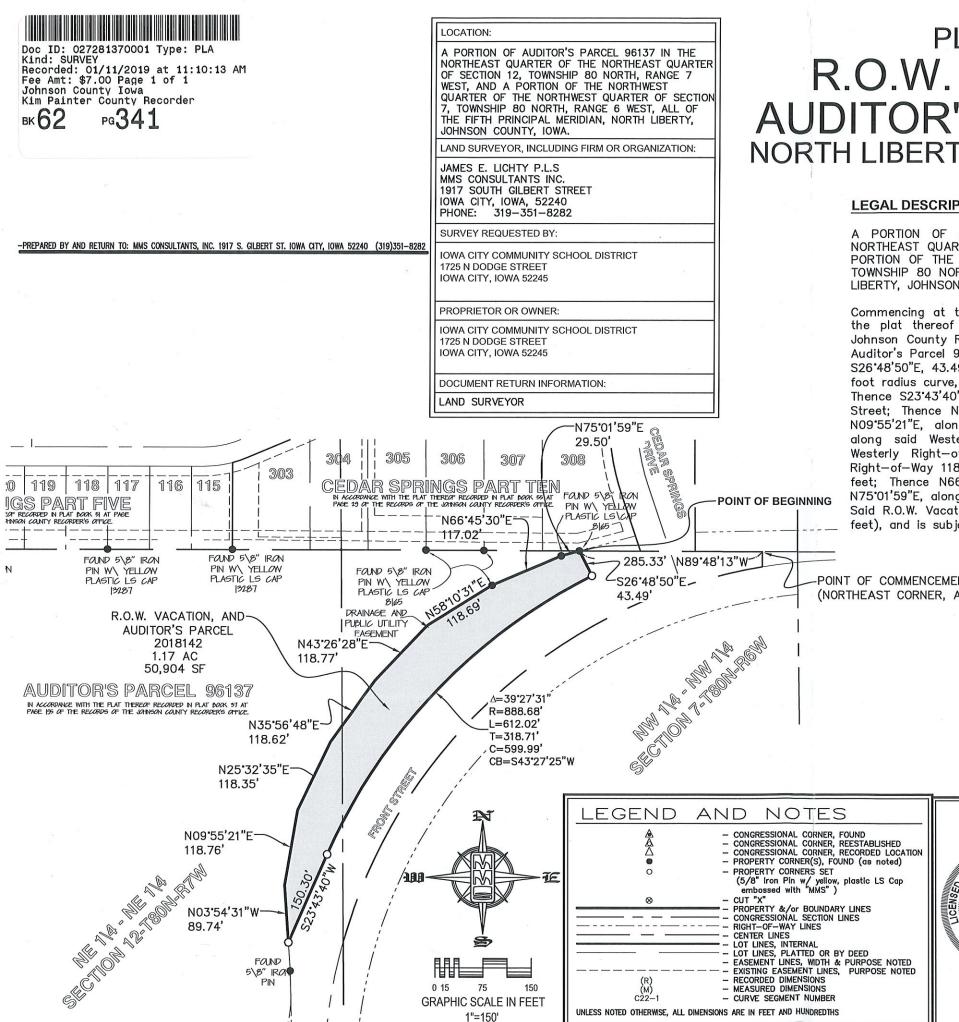

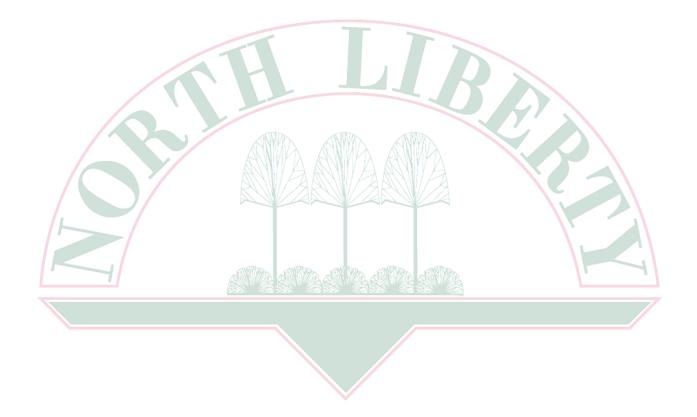

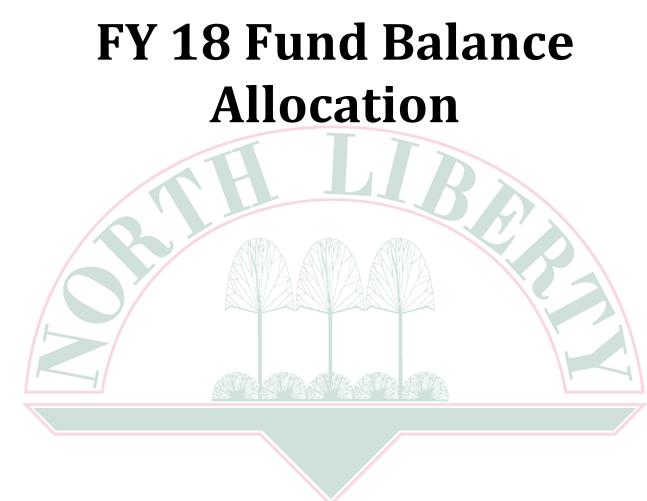


- 1. SPECIAL ELECTION
  - a. If a majority of the Council decides to call for a special election at the 1/22 meeting, the election date should be included as part of the motion.
  - b. There is no requirement for this to be done by resolution, so a motion/second/voice vote is appropriate.
  - c. Since the vacancy will not officially exist until February 1, the motion should be that the election is contingent upon the vacancy happening on February 1 and that staff should send notice of the vacancy to the County Auditor on February 1 to make the vacancy official.
  - d. If Council chooses that option on 1/22, the earliest day for special election is the first Tuesday 32 days after the seat becomes vacant (February 1) or March 5.
  - e. Per Carrie Nierling, the Elections Deputy at the Auditor's office, the following dates are recommended for Council's consideration in order of the Auditor's preference and to remain in line with the "as soon as practicable" clause in the Code:
    - 1. March 12
    - 2. March 5
    - 3. March 26
  - f. Nomination papers for the vacant seat will require a minimum of 25 signatures.
  - g. The nomination period starts as soon as the County Auditor is notified that an election has been called, February 1.
- 2. APPOINTMENT
  - a. If a majority of Council decides to appoint a new Councilor at the 2/12 meeting, the motion and second should be that the Council intends to appoint a new Councilor at the 2/12 meeting.
  - b. A decision on 1/22 about council's intent to appoint does not have to specify who might or will be appointed on 2/12.
  - c. There is no requirement for this to be done by resolution, so a motion/second/voice vote is appropriate.
  - d. 1/25/19: Clerk submits notice to the *Leader* about:
    - 1. the expected action on 2/12/19; and
    - 2. the right of citizens to petition for special election through March 1.

- d. 1/31/19: Notice is published in the *Leader* regarding Council's intended action on 2/12 and the additional notice of the right of citizens to file no later than 3/1 a petition calling for a special election.
- e. 2/12: The Council appoints a new Councilor by approval of a motion.
- f. To call for a special election, the petition needs at least 75 valid signatures of eligible electors (validity of signatures to be determined by the City Clerk).
- g. The appointment made on 2/12 remains effective until the regular City election in November 2019 or unless a special election is held. If the appointment stands, the winning candidate in the November election takes office after the official canvas is completed. If a special election is held, the winning candidate in the November election takes office in January 2020 in accordance with the regular timeline and processes laid out by state law.

### 3. MISCELLANEOUS

- a. Paragraphs 1 and 2 are based on the Council making a decision to call for a special election on 1/22 or to act on the Council's intent to appoint on 2/12. If the Council decides to take more time, the dates set out above will need to be adjusted.
- b. The Council has the option to appoint or call for a special election through April 1, 2019. If no decision is made by then, the Auditor is obligated to set a special election.
- c. An appointment of a new Councilor is effective immediately.
- d. Based on a recent estimate from the Auditor's office, a special election is likely to cost between \$2,000 and \$3,000.
- e. Any communications about the vacancy and the two options before the Council are fully subject to Open Meetings (Chapter 21) and Open Records (Chapter 22) laws.

WHEREAS, the Fund Balance Policy adopted on November 27, 2018 states that when the fund balance reserves exceed 30 percent of the next year's revenue projection, the excess funds can be used for one-time uses that achieve future operating cost reductions, for funding projects in the approved Capital Improvement Plan, for funding projects not included in the Capital Improvements Plan but otherwise deemed a priority or timely by the majority of the City Council, or for funding initiatives identified in the approved City Council Goal Setting Report can be spent by the vote of City Council;

**WHEREAS,** the City Council affirmed the FY 2018 Audit report that reflects a General Fund Unassigned Balance at the end of the fiscal year of \$5,846,853 and projected General Fund Revenues for FY 2019 are \$12,859,468 and 30% of the FY 2019 General Fund Revenues is \$3,857,840;

**WHEREAS,** the excess of \$1,989,000 is available for allocation; and

**WHEREAS,** projects and expenses should be allocated for funding from the excess reserves as shown in Attachment A.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of North Liberty, Iowa, hereby approves the allocation of excess funds from the FY 2018 General Fund Balance according to the Fund Balance Policy.

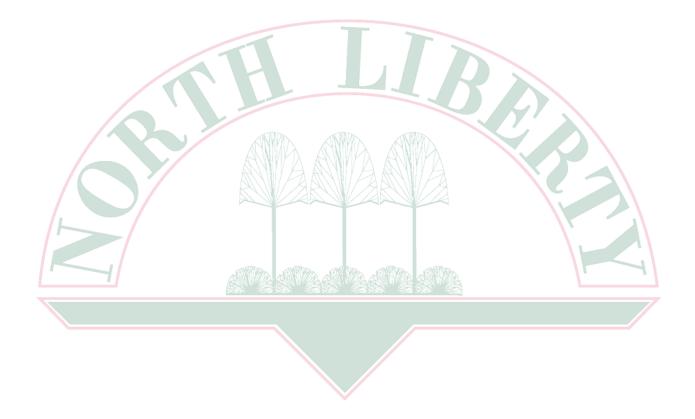

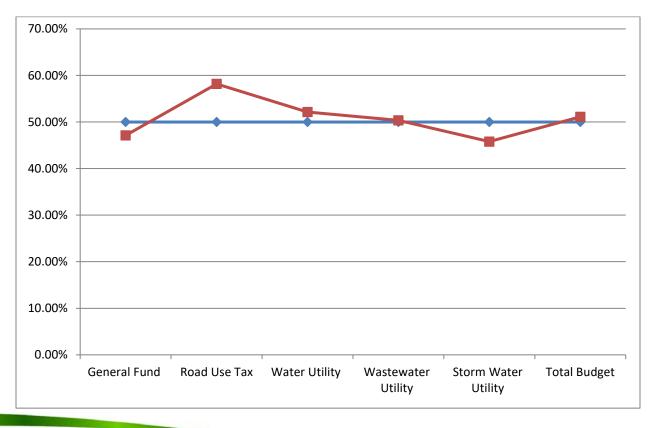
**Financial Report** December 31, 2018

City staff are pleased to submit the unaudited monthly financial report for the month of December 2018. At the end of the month, the City was 50% through the budget year. Total revenues received for the month were \$1,854,210.66. Total expenditures for the month were \$2,954,364.44. The total cash balance as of December 31, 2018 was \$18,420,403.68.

The red line indicates the percentage where the budget area is and blue line is the percentage of the budget year. Any particular area falling approximately 10% below or above the percentage of the budget year will be explained below.

#### Revenues

The following chart demonstrates the condition of the City's budgeted revenues as of December 31, 2018:

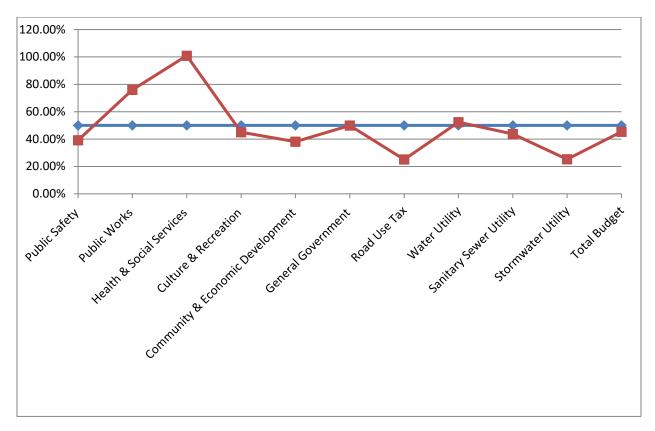


- This chart represents the historical view at the end of the month.
- The General Fund is right where it is expected at 78.13%
- Utility revenues are all on track.
- Overall revenues are above the 50% of the fiscal year principally due to property tax receipts being received in October.

Overall revenues for the fiscal year are \$26,249,240.96, 51.10% of the budgeted amount.

#### Expenditures

The following chart demonstrates the condition of the City's budgeted expenditures as of December 31, 2018:



- Health and Social Services is exceeding the percentage of expenditures for the year to date. Grants for social service programs were made in July.
- Public Works is exceeding the budgeted amount due to increased refuse collection fees. These are pass through expenses.
- Road Use Tax and Stormwater Utility expenses are more than 10% below budgeted projections due to many transfers occurring at the end of the fiscal year in June.

Year to date total expenditures are \$28,223,150.29 or 45.33% of the projected budget amounts. This amount is right on par for the portion of the fiscal year completed.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Following is the Treasurer's Report for December. The General Fund Balance is comprised of more than just the 010 General Fund. For accounting purposes of the budget and reporting, other funds such as Hotel/Motel Tax, Library Capital, Fire Capital and others are incorporated into the General total. The General Fund for operating expenses has a fund balance of \$ 5,951,295.81. The other funds in the total shown here are obligated to specific departments or types of activities. The other funds are separated out to keep those funds obligated for future specific types of expenditures.
