

Resolution No. 2022-13

**RESOLUTION APPROVING THE MAXIMUM TAX DOLLARS
FROM CERTAIN LEVIES FOR THE CITY OF NORTH LIBERTY'S
PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023**

WHEREAS, the City Council of North Liberty, Iowa is preparing the annual budget for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered the proposed Fiscal Year 2022-2023 city maximum property tax dollars for the affected levies totals; and

WHEREAS, a notice concerning the proposed city maximum property tax dollars from certain levies was published as required and posted on the city web site and social media accounts as required; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing concerning the city's maximum property tax dollars for the affected levy total was held at the city council meeting on February 22, 2022, in Council Chambers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council that the maximum property tax dollars for the affected tax levies for Fiscal Year 2022-23 shall not exceed \$10,627,664, and a levy rate of \$10.10238 which represents a revenue increase of 6.08% from the maximum property tax dollars requested for FY 2021-2022.

Explanation of significant increases in the budget:
The City is seeing a projected 15% increase in insurance premiums for general and liability coverage. The City's health insurance plan premiums will increase by 7.68%. The Police Department is adding a new staff person. Overall staff costs will increase with a cost of living and merit/step increases. The majority of the City's General Fund expenses are personnel related due to the service based nature of a municipality. A remodel of Library space to create a more patron friendly environment.
